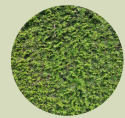

PRESTON MONTAGUE – NATIVE PIEDMONT PERENNIALS:

Join this artistic landscape architect for an examination of planting design strategies he deploys in his studio that are rooted in principles of composition. Choreographing experiences with designed plantings is a feat of art, science, and will. The old adage of "right plant, right place" applies to plant survivability of course, but can also apply to the way we arrange plants to encourage particular reactions from visitors. There's an art to the design of an experience, and there are also simple tactics that can hasten decision-making and help organize a design process. For Preston, those tactics come from composition he learned from an earlier practice as an artist.

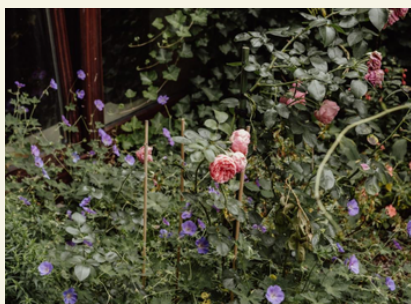

Seasonal Gardening Tips

Tis The Season To Be Freezin'!

Burrrrrr! The extended cold weather has been a challenge for us Southern gardeners. Rain, sleet, icy mix and snow has and will continue to threaten our yards, shrubs, trees and containers.

Here are six winter-gardening tips for Charlotte gardeners:

1. Protecting Plants

Use mulch to insulate roots and cover your tender plants with burlap, frost cloths or sheets to prevent damage.

2. Caring for Soil

Top-dress your garden beds with compost or leaf mold to improve the structure and acidity levels of your soil.

3. Planting

Start cold-hardy veggies like peas, spinach, celery or spring bulbs in early February, and consider starting seeds for other crops indoors.

4. Watering

Keep plants hydrated by watering deeply before freezing; avoid overwatering to prevent root rot.

5. Supporting Wildlife

Keeping your feeders filled and leaving seed heads on flowering perennials provides much needed sustenance to our wild friends!

6. Clean Up!

Clean and oil your tools and stow your lawn equipment in a dry place. Clean up fallen leaves and debris to prepare for a healthy spring garden!



Remember...

North Carolina weather can be beautiful in mid-February, with temperatures often reaching the upper 60's+ across most of the state. But don't be fooled. False spring can give false hope. Average freeze dates run from mid to late March in coastal counties and to mid-May in our western mountains.

Be vigilant about the cold that lies ahead. But do remember, spring is just around the corner!

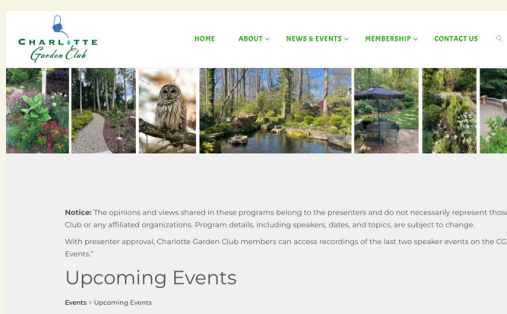
